Who We Are

UDW/CCPU-UDW represents over 126,000 home care workers who provide care to low-income seniors and people with disabilities in 21 counties through California's In-Home Supportive Services (IHSS) program. We also represent over 22,000 family child care providers in 45 counties.

What We Do

Our home care members care for low-income seniors and people with disabilities all over California so they can live in comfort and dignity. IHSS providers help our clients live at home by performing the personal care services that keep them healthy and safe. Home care saves lives and it saves money over expensive institutional care. Our child care members provide high-quality, affordable care in their homes for the children of California's working families. Family child care providers are the backbone of our economy-they make all other work possible.



Our clients are your friends, family, and community members.

Over 138,000 seniors and people with disabilities are cared for in their homes by UDW caregivers. The care our members provide allows their clients to live at home in comfort and dignity and avoid expensive and impersonal institutional care.

Thousands of children receive care from **CCPU-UDW members.** Our child care members provide high-quality, affordable early childhood education in a home-based setting. Family child care allows parents to go to their jobs knowing their children are safe and nurtured while they work.

Protecting Family Child Care During the Pandemic

(BUDGET COMMITTEE)

In 2020, CCPU-UDW won the right to represent California's family child care providers, and our union immediately proved the value of bargaining agreements in protecting the state's child care system during an emergency. AB 82 contains the first COVID-19 specific agreement between Child Care Providers United (CCPU) and the California Department of Human Resources (CalHR). This bill utilizes federal COVID-19 relief funding (CRRSA) for the following: stipends for providers accepting subsidies, essential worker childcare vouchers, additional child care slots for children of essential workers, temporary subsidy extension and an increase in paid closure days from 24 to 40 days. Additionally, this bill allocated funding to waive family fees through June 30, 2021.

THE C.R.I.S.E.S. ACT

Up to half of all people killed by police are people with disabilities. As a union of workers who care for seniors and people with disabilities, UDW has long worked to make interactions between police and the general public safer. Most experts agree limiting police response to only those situations where they are needed is key to establishing that safety. AB 118 establishes the Community Response Initiative to Strengthen Emergency Systems (C.R.I.S.E.S.) Act Pilot Grant Program to expand the participation of community-based organizations in emergency response roles for vulnerable populations.

By expanding the participation of communitybased organizations in emergency response situations, this bill is designed to provide the right type of response for people with disabilities, individuals experiencing homelessness, and other at-risk populations by offering the presence of trained professionals from organizations who are familiar with and regularly serve these communities.

Historic First Contract and Additional COVID-19 Relief for Family Child Care Providers

(BUDGET COMMITTEE)

This budget trailer bill contains CCPU's inaugural collective bargaining agreement with the state, as well as a second COVID-19 relief package for family child care providers. As a result of this historic contract, reimbursement rates have been increased to the 2018 Regional Market Rate (RMR) at the 75th percentile with additional supplemental funding that intends to provide all family child care providers with at least a 15% pay increase during the contract period. This bill establishes a process for grievance and arbitration and creates joint labor-management committees (JLMC) to address the myriad issues child care providers face that did not fit in the scope of the first contract. Additional victories within this bill include licensing incentives and additional

stipends for child care providers, a family fee waiver extension, mental health supports, a training partnership fund, 16 additional paid non-operational days, 200,000 additional child care slots for 0 - 3-year-olds, and a hold harmless provision that would pay providers based on enrollment rather than attendance.

Restoring IHSS Hours and Improving IHSS Collective Bargaining

(BUDGET COMMITTEE)

After nearly a decade of fighting to permanently restore the 7% across-the-board cut to IHSS service hours, AB 135 eliminates the 7% reduction and repeals the state law that kept it in place. This bill also contains provisions that would impose a fiscal penalty on counties who fail to bargain with us in good faith. We have seen for far too long that counties will continue

to pay providers just above minimum wage for life-saving work. AB 135 would also maintain critical collective bargaining mechanisms such as the 65% state/35% county cost-sharing ratio which ensures continued progress in collective bargaining.

Career Development for Caregivers

(BUDGET COMMITTEE)

This bill establishes the Career Pathways Program for IHSS providers and providers of Waiver Personal Care Services (WPCS) with the goal of increasing the quality of care and improving provider recruitment and retention within the IHSS program. The program would allow providers to build upon their existing experience by providing training opportunities in the home care industry and to increase the quality of care for clients. Participation would be voluntary and made available at no cost and providers would be compensated for the amount of time it takes to complete the training. In addition, providers would be eligible for incentive-based payments as a result of completing specified coursework in the program.

Kenneth Ross Jr. Police Decertification Act

SB 2, the Kenneth Ross Jr. Police Decertification Act of 2021, establishes a statewide process to revoke the certification of a peace officer following the conviction of serious crimes such as but not limited to misconduct, excessive force, and sexual misconduct or abuse. Prior to the passage of SB 2, California was one of only four states that did not have a decertification process in place. SB 2 will simply ensure that bad-acting law enforcement officers who commit acts of serious misconduct are held accountable for their actions.

Extending State Supplemental Paid Sick Leave for COVID-19

During the COVID-19 pandemic, the Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA) provided up to two weeks of paid sick leave for reasons related to COVID-19. As the pandemic endured and with COVID-19 continuing its spread across both vaccinated and unvaccinated populations, California passed SB 95 and established the State Supplemental Sick Leave benefit, which allotted two more weeks of paid sick leave and extended the deadline to September 30, 2021. This additional sick leave benefit was effective on March 29, 2021 and was able to be applied retroactively to January 1, 2021. An additional two weeks was extremely beneficial, especially for IHSS providers who may have been exposed to COVID-19.

LEGISLATOR SCHOOL SCHOO

Which legislators supported the rights of caregivers, child care workers, children, seniors & people with disabilities?

This scorecard tallies votes by California state legislators on UDW priority legislation. Each Assemblymember or Senator has been scored using votes taken on the Assembly or Senate floor and votes taken in policy or fiscal committees. Abstentions and unexcused absences are scored as votes in opposition to UDW priorities.

The vote tallies produce a percentage that represents how often the member voted in favor of UDW priority legislation. Higher scores mean that the legislator voted more often in favor of UDW priority legislation and lower scores means that the legislator more often voted in opposition.

We list each vote made by an Assemblymember or Senator on UDW priority legislation. Because of different committee memberships, some legislators voted more times than others. These votes are the basis for generating a legislator's score. In addition, each legislator's career score is listed next to their 2021 score. Their career score indicates how often they voted in favor of UDW legislative priorities during their tenure in the legislature.
